

CCA Face Covering Policy

In accordance with Governor Wolf's mask mandate, [PA Facial Covering Mandate](#), CCA will require all students to wear a facial covering (mask, face shield or gaiter cover) whenever they are unable to social distance at 6 feet apart. This includes within the classroom. CCA will do their best to allow for mask breaks throughout the day, including when eating, drinking, in a classroom with the ability to sit 6 feet apart or when outside. Students can be exempted from wearing a mask for medical, mental health or other disability reasons. Please provide documentation from a doctor or counselor for this exemption.

With the ability to social distance or utilize plexiglass shields within the classroom, PK through 1st grade will not have to wear a mask while seated at their desks.

Families will need to provide coverings for their children.

When the governor lifts the face covering mandate, CCA will do the same, while continuing to practice proper health and cleaning practices.

Updated Face Covering Policy as of 8/13/20

As we prepare for the start of school, we want to highlight a new edition to our students' supply lists - face coverings (masks/shields/neck gaiters). Face coverings (for the time being) will be considered part of CCA's dress code and a requirement for school attendance. Please make sure your child has a face covering to wear and a couple to spare. Please place the spares in a Ziplock bag in your child's backpack. All face coverings should be labeled with your child's name.

While we love to see our students' personalities shine through their face coverings, we do ask that face coverings stay away from political, social, or secular messages. School should be a place in which we educate and discuss such ideas, but not a place to promote or endorse such messages. We encourage masks that have designs over ones that have words. As an extension of our dress code, face coverings that promote secular bands or face coverings that are dark, gruesome, or scary are not appropriate

either. Examples of some possible mask prints include: favorite sports team, favorite sport, favorite food, or favorite animal.

If a student has lost both original and spare face coverings, replacement masks will be available at the Elementary and High School Office for a dollar. We thank you for your continued support and prayers for CCA as we prepare for this up coming school year.
