Dear CCA Parents and Guardians,

The Pennsylvania Department of Health revised the immunization requirements for students effective August 2017. This revision replaced the 8- month provisional period for immunizations with the new requirement of a <u>5-day provisional period</u>.

All students must have all immunizations completed within the first 5 days of school.

If the student is in the middle of a series and it is too soon for the next dose, the parent must provide the school nurse with a plan for immunizations (signed by a health care provider) within the first 5 days of school. If the student has incomplete immunizations and no medical plan, the student will be excluded from school.

These requirements allow for the following exemptions: medical reasons; religious beliefs; or philosophical/strong moral or ethical conviction. A signed, dated exemption must be on file in the nurse's office.

If your child is exempt from immunizations, he or she may be removed from school during an outbreak.

Dear Parents,

This school year we saw continued development of CCA Athletics at the Middle School, Junior Varsity, and Varsity levels. We saw a productive year at the Middle School level in both Girls and Boys sports, where there was a focus on building an energetic, fun environment where athletes could learn to compete in a Godhonoring way. It is very encouraging to see the development, progress, and success happening at our lower levels across the board. We even saw a BAL Championship from our Middle School Boys Soccer team as they closed out a fantastic season in the fall.

At the Varsity level, though collectively we did not see the level of success we had hoped for, we are optimistic about the future of each of our respective programs. In the fall, we saw our Girls Cross Country team win the BAL Championship, District Championship, and finish 5th overall in the State. Boys Soccer qualified for the District playoffs for the first time in four years. In the winter, the Girls Basketball team qualified for District Playoffs, while the Cheerleading team won their third straight BAL Championship. This spring, our Softball team is on pace for another strong regular season finish and a possible deep playoff run. Our Track and Field team is in the midst of a great season for both the boys and girls and is poised for a strong finish towards Districts and for some, State Championship qualifying.

Though these accomplishments and achievements are encouraging, our greatest success of CCA Athletics was the impact it had on the 200+ student-athletes in their walk with Christ. Our goal in CCA Athletics is to excel both athletically and in developing young men and women for Christ. We pray that CCA Athletics is challenging our young men and women to grow physically, emotionally, and mentally; but most importantly spiritually.

Junior Varsity/Varsity Athletes:

An athlete's absence from these preseason tryouts/practices may result in his/her inability to make the team or hinder his/her participation due to the lack of coach's evaluation and commitment. *Please plan accordingly regarding planning vacations or making other plans that would affect your athlete's attendance during these weeks*.



Registration/Paperwork

All forms can be found at <u>https://ccacougarathletics.org/main/filesLinks/</u>. We must receive the following items by **Friday, August 2nd, 2019** in order for your son or daughter to try out for a team:

- PIAA Physical (Sections 1-6). Sections 1-5 need to be filled by a parent/guardian along with your athlete's signature. Section 6 must be filled out, dated, and signed by a licensed physician on/after June 1st, 2019. Physicals that are not completed and dated on or after this date will not be accepted. In addition, any physical that is filled out on a non-PIAA form will not be accepted (ex. Dept. of Health Form).
 - If you are having trouble obtaining a physical due to insurance restrictions, Pharmacy Clinics (CVS, Walgreens, Rite Aid, etc.) will complete PIAA physicals for athletes for a fee. Urgent Care Centers can also provide physicals for a fee. This would be a recommended option if you are not able to schedule a physical with your athlete's doctor in the time frame needed.



- We strongly suggest that all athletes (fall, winter, spring) have their physicals completed over the summer. This will prevent any possible delays with appointment scheduling or any unforeseen issues that may arise.

Senior Pictures Class of 2020

Seniors,

Congratulations! With the help and support of your family, you've come a long way to finally graduate this coming spring! This is a very big accomplishment that I am pleased to be a part of by photographing your senior pictures this year! Here is some information I hope you find helpful regarding senior pictures:

When : Senior pictures will be taken at Calvary Christian Academy from Tuesday, August 20 th , 2019 to Thursday, August 22 nd , 2019. The school has scheduled you on a specific day and time . They will be informing each student about what day and time their senior pictures will be scheduled for. Please check let me know if you need to be rescheduled for a different day or time. I have also attached in this email the dates and times for each individual student.

Cost : When you arrive to have your pictures taken you will need to bring your sitting fee with you .

Full Photo Session - \$40.00

Yearbook Only picture - \$20.00.

~ The Full Photo Session includes the Yearbook Shots (see below for details) as well as an additional casual photo shoot where you can showcase your interests and personality. You may bring ONE change of clothes- keep in mind that simplicity usually works best so stay away from large patterns or distracting stripes or prints. Solids usually work well or something with a subtle pattern. Bold colors can also be somewhat distracting. We want your face to be the focal point of your pictures. Traditional styles will stand the test of time and keep your portrait looking fresh for years to come. Coordinate your outfit from head to toe because we will be doing different kinds of poses.

~ The Yearbook Only session is mandatory. You must at least have your yearbook pictures taken with us for the school yearbook. These photos are \$20.00 and include cap and gown shots as well as drape photos for girls and tux photos for guys.

Tips-

Guys will be photographed in a tux that we provide. The cap and gown will also be provided and for the guys it is dark blue and it shows your collar underneath so you may want to bring a dress shirt and tie for under it. Or you can use the tux shirt that we provide for under the gown or you can wear a polo shirt or t-shirt depending on how dressy or casual you want the pictures to be. Please remember to shave before you come, and note that I will not be editing out any 5 oclock shadows for free.

Girls will be photographed in a black v-neck drape that we provide- you will need a white or nude colored tank top for underneath and be able to pull the straps down because the top part of your shoulders will show. We will also have the cap and gown for those shots. The cap and gown will also be provided and for the girls it is white and see through so make sure you don't have on anything with color underneath which could show up in your pictures.

TIPS:

*Some poses will show your shoes so don't forget to bring shoes & socks for each outfit that you plan to wear. Barefoot and sandals will work for your casual clothes. * Be careful with sunburn and/or tan lines as they will show up in your pictures. Try to remember this for the whole week prior to your photo session.

*Props can help to show your personality and record the types of activities you are involved in. Be sure to bring some of your own props to your portrait session, i.e. musical instrument, sport jerseys, ball, helmet, bat, sports equipment, sunglasses, pom poms, newspaper, art supplies, class ring, etc.

Feel free to bring just about anything with you that can be photographed inside on a regular sized backdrop. * If you wear glasses , consider being photographed without them or without the lenses because sometimes a glare is created that cannot be fixed.

*Don't experiment the day before your pictures with a new hair cut or style just in case it does not work out. Guys should make sure that they shave on the day of your session, five o' clock shadows don't look very nice.

What if I can't make my date and time scheduled for me?

There will be a senior photo "make-up" date sent out after school begins in the fall. Please let Toni Marie Photography know ahead of time if you will not be able to make your original date and time for senior photos in August so you can be added to an email list that will be notified about "make-up" dates at a later time. Thank you.

***Payments must be made in checks or cash. All checks must be made payable to Toni Marie Photography. There will be a fee for any bounced checks. Thank you!

~ Package and Ordering information will be sent out after your photo session.
