Your score report will include your critical reading, math and writing skills; score ranges; percentiles; and Selection Index (critical reading + math + writing skills scores), which NMSC uses as an initial screen of the large number of entrants to its competitions. Your score report will show the correct answers, your answers, difficulty level of each question, math content involved, skills that need strengthening.</p> <p>The PSAT Scores may help students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Assess his/her ability to do college work • Firm up college plans with parents • Predict his/her college entrance exams scores for the SAT exam • Become familiar with the testing format of the SAT exam • Receive materials for college through the Student Search Service of the CollegeBoard. • Qualify for the National Merit Scholarships and Achievement Scholarships Junior year
